- 1. Meeting called to order by Richard Ramey at 10:05 AM.
- 2. Minutes read and accepted by vote
- 3. No Treasurer's report
- 4. Program, Part One

A presentation on Y2K expectations and preparedness was presented by Chris Taylor, of the National Crisis Response Institute.

Program, Part Two

Cecil Whaley gave us a report of the meeting he attended in Washington that dealt with the Y2K issue.

Both programs were interesting and informative; Chris Taylor also had several handouts that were helpful in explaining this issue with our colleagues back home. This is a subject we will be increasingly questioned about, and will have to deal with as the new year rolls around, so we need as much current information as we can get. The general consensus is that we should take this opportunity to instruct the populace in how to be self-sufficient in caring for themselves and their families.
