SETVOAD

Southeast Tennessee VOAD, the first Sub-State VOAD, was asked to send a copy of it's by-laws to the State VOAD for it's records.

Sub-State VOADs

Discussion centered on ways to encourage the establishment of Sub-State VOADs. It was decided to set them up by urban, rather than regional areas. Memphis, Nashville, and Knoxville were targeted for organizational efforts, including visits by TEMA and State VOAD officers, a letter of introduction from TEMA and FEMA, and personal calls to regional TEMAs, encouraging them to actively recruit members to form Sub-State VOADs.

Agency Updates

SECOND HARVEST – Working in the Hendersonville and Gallatin area, distributing food boxes.

UMCOR – Tom Rasco reported work done in Perry CO., Nashville, and Clarksville in rebuilding and refurbishing.

TBC – Tim Bearden reported that work was being done in Perry Co. with chainsaw crews, Clarksville with rebuilding and unmet needs, Nashville with cleanup and chainsaw crews, and that their shower trailer went to Kansas.

ACS – Larry Buckner reported that ACS had 5 fixed-site warehouses and 1 mobile distribution vehicle in the Kansas – Oklahoma area – a total of 270,000 square feet of warehouse space that was operating as multi-agency facilities.

BellSouth Buzz

Was approved as the web site operator for TVOAD. They will offer training sessions on how to set up and maintain a web site.
